Shimpling Short Stories

Did you know that Shimpling is becoming a hub of literary endeavours?



On Saturday 11th Feb, around a dozen people came from as far afield as Wiltshire to hone their short story writing skills in the barn at Shimpling Park Farm.

The course was taught by Tom Henry, one of this country's top ghost writers. He has ghost written books for people from all sorts of life and backgrounds, but of course, because he is a ghost writer, the object is that we don't know exactly for whom he has written in most cases.

It was rapidly evident that we were in experienced hands and gaining expert guidance and encouragement in our efforts. How did we know? Because after clear instructions from Tom we were all producing writing of which we might never previously have thought ourselves capable.

By the end of the day we had all furiously scribbled our way through a number of set tasks and shared them with the supportive group of fellow novices, though I think in some cases some of the people were rather experienced writers, including two fairly local ladies who belong to a U3A writing group.

The participants were of all ages and some had worked under Tom Henry's guidance before, either a few years back at Shimpling Park Farm or at Lavenham Literary Festival last year.

The courses were the brainchild of Alice Pawsey in conjunction with her long-standing friend Tom who met each other again after years of not being in touch when they both attended the funeral of a mutual friend.

Not only was the farm an inspiring place to think, write and learn but Alice's cooking of home-grown produce was also very much appreciated. Nobody went hungry there on Saturday with home grown oats for flapjacks, home reared



organic lamb for lunch, lemon meringue pie and fabulous rich fruit cake too; there was plenty of fuel for our brain work! There are two more day courses later this year on writing a TV drama pilot (May 20th) and memoir writing (September 30th). Lent Course - Mountain Tops

Mountain-top experiences are a regular feature of both the Old

SHIMPLING AND ALPHETON WI 10TH JANUARY 2023

Steph Eady, President, welcomed us all to the meeting and wished us a Happy New Year. She then introduced our speaker for the evening Mr Karl Lumbars who



proceeded to give us a fascinating talk entitled "The Trinity House Story". Trinity House is the General Lighthouse Authority for England, Wales, Channel Islands and Gibraltar. It operates lighthouses as well as many buoys and lightships. It is dedicated to the safety, welfare and training of mariners. Trinity House was founded in 1514 by King Henry VIII to licence pilots on the river Thames This was expanded in 1566 by Queen Elizabeth I to allow it to build lighthouses. The first lighthouse was built at Lowestoft and was powered by candles and built of wood. Eddystone lighthouse was the first offshore lighthouse built in 1698, although it has been rebuilt 3 times. Originally, lighthouse keepers were put both on and off the lighthouses by bosuns chair, a very dangerous undertaking, especially in rough weather. This method remained until 1969 when helicopters were first used. Today all lighthouses are unmanned, the tiny LED lights being replaced remotely.

The charitable arm of Trinity House looks after almshouses in Deal, Kent and provides scholarships for young people seeking careers as officers in the Merchant Navy and supports other Maritime Charities.

FEBRUARY 14TH 2023

Steph Eady President welcomed us all to the meeting. She then introduced our speaker for the evening Mr John Saunders, the subject of his talk "Time goes by". John started his slide tour of Bury St Edmunds timepieces in the corner of

Angel Hill, the original position of the John Gershom Parkington clock museum. There above the door is a lovely example of a wall clock. Frederic Gershom Parkington bought rare clocks, watches and sundials as a hobby. In 1953 he bequeathed his collection to St Edmunds Borough council in memory of his son John who was killed during the 2nd World War. In 1993 the collection was moved to the Manor House museum on Honey Hill where it remained until 2006. Since 2007 the timepieces have been on display at Moyse's Hall museum. From Angel hill we were taken to the Atheneum, the Abbey gardens and various locations around the town centre. Some of the clocks have disappeared along with the building they were placed upon, but we all agreed that most of us had never noticed many of the clocks and sundials placed around the town centre but would be looking much more carefully in the future.

HARTEST AND DISTRICT GARDENING CLUB

We have had excellent attendances at our January and February meetings, with both existing and new members, and



visitors. Simon White, from Peter Beales Roses, was a very entertaining speaker in January, and "Rose Growing Made Easy" was obviously a popular subject. He was happy to answer lots of our questions - although we are very keen on them, roses obviously cause us some problems! He had also brought a good selection of plants for sale, along with other accessories. I think his car was a bit lighter for his journey home.

Our Chairman reminded those present at the February meeting to get sowing their seeds – it is only a couple of months until May and our Plant sale, when the bigger the plants are the better. Annie's Plant of the Month returned, Danae Racemosa, or the Poets Laurel, so called because it was used by the Romans for laurel wreaths for their Poets Laureate. It sounds a delightful plant, useful for dry shade, with a glossy appearance and bright berries.

We had been waiting a while for Lucy Skellorn to come and speak to us, and she didn't disappoint. Her story of researching, and trying to find, the irises bred by her great-great-grandfather, and the side tracks she was taken down, was fascinating. And the link with Sarah Cook, the Cedric Morris Irises and the future for Benton End will be interesting to follow. At the March meeting we will hear the Head Gardener of Ulting Wick in Essex tell us about her role and how the unique look of the garden, including two highly ornate planting schemes a year, is achieved. In April we see the return of Jim Paine, from Walnut Tree Nursery, who will be talking about the intriguing subject of "The Secret Life of Plants", which will explore some of

the latest and most remarkable discoveries about the inner workings of plants. And May is a busy month, first will be the aforementioned Plant Sale, hopefully on Hartest Green, on Sunday 14th starting at 2pm. If the weather doesn't co-operate we will be in the Institute. It is best to arrive early! The next day, Monday 15th, sees our monthly meeting, delayed a couple of weeks due to bank holidays. Our speaker then will be another returning one – Zsuzsa Serer, telling us this time about Orchids. I think we will all learn a lot from these three speakers - entry now to the meetings is £2.50 for members, and £5 for visitors, including refreshments. Annual subscriptions are £12.50, but there is no pressure to join. The meetings start at 7.30pm, at the Institute Hall.

News from The Bush

As was my understanding from the village meeting before Xmas, the overwhelming view amongst the villagers is the community hub idea,



which is also in line with what we want to do, so.....

We are starting some renovation and refurbish works coming week and will expect to do so for about 3-4 weeks. Beer garden will be seen to over the spring.

We are advertising for staff and talking with some guys we believe fit the bill at the moment, so that we will get a great group of people working at the pub.

Idea is that all produce offered should come from as close locally as possible. That is food, wine, beer and liquor alike. This because of various reasons, but it's clear looking at the present vegetable situation in UK that we all have to rethink a bit and embrace eating local and seasonal produce. This is something that is very much our core plan and we trust guests/villagers will agree and support this.

We aim to have a cafe open some mornings/days per week. My wife Kristin ran a cafe over in France previously, so she's an obvious candidate to take that part.

We also aim to have a tiny little village shop at the pub. Nothing you should expect to do your weekly shopping at, but will come in handy if you're out of milk, teabags etc for breakfast, or maybe a bottle of great local wine for the evening. We will also borrow an idea from a restaurant we supply wine to, where they have a food cupboard with ingredient's for the meal served that particular evening only.

Opening days/hours are not set yet so we will have to come back on that, however aim is to open at Easter week. If we have found a great chef by then, well then we would be very lucky, if not, then unfortunately you will have to be patient as we will not do anything unless it's as good as we want it to be. I trust you will appreciate that way of thinking.

So unless we bump into anything unforeseen we will open up doors at Easter. We will also work around Village hall with events and opening at coronation weekend with pub quiz and entertainment already planned.

We have liaised with Village hall committee about the "Lantern Walk" from the village to the Coronation Party at the Vineyard on Sunday 7th May. We will have some great entertainment, drinks, nibbles and bonfires at the vineyard from 6pm. We will also invite Stanstead village and have some friendly games and competitions between the villages at the evening. I think it has the potential to be a fantastic spring/summer night out, so do write a little something about it. Pub will be closed this date as well!


